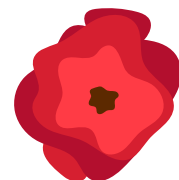
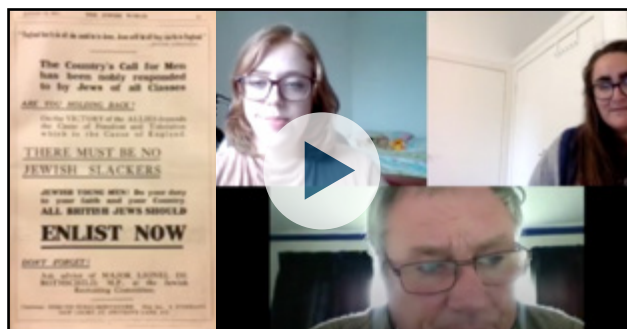

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

- Do you know any stories about your ancestors during the time of the First World War? Were any of your great-grandparents involved as soldiers, or in other ways such as nurses? If not, do you know what their lives were like at the time?
- If your family hadn't yet come to the UK at the time of the First World War, do you know where they were, and what sort of social and political effects the War had on them?
- Why do you think it's important to learn the history of the First World War? Why do you think it's important to learn about the Jewish community's involvement in the War?
- What do you think changes when we learn the personal stories of individuals who served in the War, as opposed to thinking about the First World War as a single mass entity?
- During the time of the First World War, people may have felt tensions between their identities as Jews and their identities as Brits. Have you ever felt this tension in your life?
- Are there any world events which you feel have had a profound effect on your life? What are they?
