Si3 UPDATE APRIL 2022

During the past year, many Israelis continued to suffer deeply from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Whilst recent reports highlighted Israel's impressive economic performance in 2021, it also highlighted that this is not shared by all members of society, and that the gaps between "haves and have nots" remain very large. NEW DEALS

Since our last update, we continued to source deals and made the following new investments, which exceeded our expectations given the economic environment.

Jump.in (Loan): Offers training and placement in digital marketing for disadvantaged Israelis to help them find quality employment in Israel's hi-tech sector. Mentoring from Jump.in's professional staff enables participants to develop soft skills needed for successful entry to the workforce and future advancement.



Arab-Israeli Loan Fund (Loan): Si3 invested in a second loan fund managed by Koret (KIEDF) that offers credit to Arab-Israeli businesses. These businesses struggle to get credit from traditional banking sources. Since unemployment and underemployment is a key reason behind high poverty and growing violence in this community, this fund is meeting a critical need.

Social Space (2 Loans): Si3 approved two loans to Social Space, a non-profit organisation focusing on social activism. The first is to finance a youth hostel that will serve as a revenue generator for its activities in a former strip club in Tel Aviv, which has been converted into a space for social activism. The second loan expands its activities to a new location that serves as a hub/workspace for NGOs.

Gvanim Shel Matok (Shades of Sweetness) (Loan): Youth aged 15-18 who have already dropped out of school are taught how to make and sell chocolates and the critical employment skills they need in an effort to keep them occupied and off the streets. This loan was first brought to Si3 more than a year ago and was put on hold at the request of the company due to COVID. We are pleased to have now been able to make this investment at the beginning of 2022.

We are currently reviewing four new deals and will share details on these new investments in the coming months.

PORTFOLIO COMPANY UPDATES

Siraj on the London Roadshow: The Bedouin tech company we invested in last year was selected by the British Embassy in Israel to be part of its London Roadshow. Siraj was one of five leading Arab start-ups that enjoyed a week of networking and skills development in December 2021. CEO Othman Elsheikh was also named one of the 100 Israeli Tech Leaders You Need to know in the Wall Street Journal. See the article [here](#).

Lotus Award: Maisa Halaby, founder and CEO of Lotus, an Si3 supported hub for Druze women was bestowed with the Knight Award by the Peres Centre for Peace and Innovation for her work to open doors and create employment opportunities for many Druze women.

Extra Tech Change of Model: the work space for members of Ultra-Orthodox community (formerly known as Ampersand) changed its model during COVID and is now focusing on training and placement of men and women in the workforce.
